Bio: Kristan Poirot, Associate Professor at Texas A&M University, has a Ph.D. in Speech Communication with a graduate certificate in Women's & Gender Studies from the University of Georgia. Her research engages the concerns of contemporary critical theorists, rhetoricians, and historians by examining the circulation of sex, gender, and race identifications in U.S. contexts that span from the nineteenth century onward. She teaches courses on Black freedom and feminist movements, public culture, rhetoric, and democratic engagement. She has served Texas A&M University extensively since her arrival in 2009, including her current appointment as the Executive Associate Head for Communication & Journalism, and her previous appointments as the Associate-Head of Graduate Studies for Communication and Faculty Fellow for the Division of Student Affairs.
